When should I go to the Urgent Care Center?

For injuries or illnesses that are not life-threatening but need immediate attention. Typical complaints appropriate for urgent care include:

- ➤ Upper respiratory infections
- ➤ Coughs & congestion
- ➤ Diarrhea
- ➤ Sore throats
- ➤Insect bites
- **≻**Rashes

➤ Minor lacerations

- ➤ Sprains, strains or contusions
- ➤ Mild to moderate asthma attacks
- > Ear infections
- ➤ Urinary tract infections

When should I go to the Emergency Room?

If you are experiencing a life-threatening illness or injury, call 911\* to get professional help immediately. Examples of life threatening symptoms include:

- >Severe bleeding
- Difficulty breathing
- ➤ Chest pain or pressure
- ➤Broken bones

- ➤ Partial or total amputation of a limb
- >Trauma or injury to the head
- ➤ Sudden dizziness or difficulty seeing
- ➤ Severe abdominal pain
